



How do I qualify?

Meet all standard high school graduation requirements and one of the following:

GOLD SEAL

- ✓ Four (4) foreign language credits in the same language with a cumulative state unweighted GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale in these courses.

AND

- ✓ A level 4 or higher on the grade 10 FSA ELA assessment.

OPTION 1

SILVER SEAL

- ✓ Four (4) foreign language credits in the same language with a cumulative state unweighted GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale in these courses.

- ✓ Earn an advanced qualifying score on a nationally recognized exam, as approved by the FLDOE (i.e., AP, IB, SAT, - see chart for complete list).

OPTION 2

- ✓ Earn an intermediate qualifying score on a nationally recognized exam, as approved by the FLDOE (i.e., AP, IB, SAT, - see chart for complete list).

A student electing option two (2) who is not enrolled in an AP World Language course but believes they have the potential to receive a qualifying score on a World Language AP exam may do so at no cost. A student must communicate his/her desire to take an AP exam to their school counselor by January 15th in order for the school to order the exam. All other students are responsible for exam fees, scheduling and reporting of scores to their school for eligibility. See district website for more detailed information.
